






# Principal Royal College

## 1892-1902

As Principal, Harward taught 20 of the 25 hours each week on a salary of Rs 9600/annum.

He had no clerical assistance and, so, collected school fees by himself.

He recruited the first lady teacher to Royal.

He introduced football to Royal in 1896.

He was a keen cricketer and umpired at matches, including the Royal-Thomian.

He spoke Sinhala with ease.

On retirement, Harward moved to Australia and settled down in the remote country town of Warwick, Queensland.

S.S. Perera's book "History of Royal College 1835-1985" states that "Harward died in Warwick on the 30<sup>th</sup> of September 1932"

George Fernando is a long standing member of the Victorian Old Boys' Association, RCOBAA. Based on these references, some years ago George made inquiries from the cemetery authorities at Warwick. They confirmed that there was indeed a John Henry Harward buried there. Soon thereafter George followed up with a visit to the Warwick cemetery during a trip to Queensland, but failed to find the exact location of the grave.



Around April this year, RCOBAA (President Inji Wijegunaratne and George Fernando) alerted Rohan Jayaratne (Founder President, QORA) to S S Perera's references and George's attempt to trace the location of the grave. We conducted some research into this and contacted Mark McGovern of the SDRC





### Harward's Grave


QORA organized a three-man expedition to Warwick, Southern Darling Downs on 14<sup>th</sup> July 2017 to locate the grave





## Harward's Grave

There are two intriguing findings stemming from this discovery

 The date of death in the College records (and in S.S. Perera's book) is the 30<sup>th</sup> of September 1932.

The date on the headstone is the 26<sup>th</sup> of August 1932.

The records need to be corrected.

2. The headstone on the adjoining grave is engraved "Theodore Harward. Born 1861. Died 1935"



This is just three years apart and strongly suggests that Theodore was the younger brother of John.A possible reason for John settling down in the remote town of Warwick in rural Queensland in 1902.

### And finally....


During his tenure at Royal College Principal Harward lived at Ward Place, Colombo 7 in a house called 'Montrose'. When Harward moved to Warwick in retirement he named his house 'Montrose'. According to George Fernando's inquiries a few years ago,
'Montrose' in Warwick was still standing.....and yet to be found.
